Establishment of Farmers Associations in Pohnpei Municipalities

One of the project's outputs is to establish a coordination mechanism to assist the progress of the project development and to ensure that the project priorities and responsibilities are coordinated among relevant stakeholders.

Madolenihmw, Kitti and U municipalities in Pohnpei have successfully elected their officers for their Farmers Associations. The officers will then elect two members from their groups to represent their respective municipalities at the state level, to ensure their participation in the formulation and implementation of the project activities.

Members of Madolenihmw's Farmers Association are Chair, Patterson K. Shed; Vice Chair, Winfred Mwudong; Treasurer, Sihna Lawrence; Secretary, Phyllis Silbanuz and members Stuard Penias and Presler Costigan.

Members of Kitti Farmers Association are President, Emilio Eperiam; Vice President, Ringlen Hadley; and Secretary and Treasurer, Ivenglynn Andon.

And for U Municipality, the members are President, Mason Albert; Vice President, Santiago Joab Jr, and Secretary and Treasurer, Youteenia Sakai.

The project is still working with Nett and Sokehs municipalities to develop their Farmers Associations. The same mechanism will also be developed in the rest of the FSM states.



On October 28th, 2022, Project Manager Mr. Mark Kostka attended the 19th annual Marine Protected Areas (MPA) cross-site visit with other conservation partners at Nanwap, Madolenihmw. At the cross-site visit, Mr. Kostka provided a brief overview of the project including its components and objectives. He also highlighted that the ocean is integral to food security. The ocean's ability to provide for humanity is interrupted by harmful activities including exploitation, development, and climate change thus establishing well-connected networks of MPAs will help protect, restore and enhance our ocean health.

In addition to the purpose of the visit, the project team is currently working to establish farmers associations at the state level and this is integral in garnering more involvement from farmers at the community level.
